

Choose your Type of Caravan

Here's a breakdown of the main types of caravans, tailored to different uses and preferences:

□ Touring Caravans

- **Best for:** Families or couples planning regular travel on paved roads.
- Features:

- Limitations: Canvas sections may not be ideal for extreme weather.

□ Vintage Caravans

- Limitations: May require more maintenance and specialised parts.
