	Exterior: Wash and wax the caravan to protect the paintwork.
	Interior: Vacuum carpets, wipe down surfaces, and clean cupboards.
	<b>Fridge</b> : Empty, defrost, and leave the door ajar to prevent mold.
	Toilet: Empty and clean the cassette or tank.

•	<b>Description:</b> The caravan is stored in a fenced or secured outdoor area.

# • Disadvantages:

- o Exposure to the elements (weather, UV rays).
- o Higher risk of theft or vandalism (depending on security).
- o Potential damage from wind, rain, or hail.

# □ Covered Storage

• **Description:** The caravan is stored under a roof or shelter but remains outside.

#### Advantages:

- o Protection from direct sun and rain, though not fully enclosed.
- o More affordable than indoor storage.

#### Disadvantages:

- o Still vulnerable to some weather elements (wind, snow, etc.).
- o Security may be less than indoor storage but better than open-air.

# □ Driveway or Private Land Storage

• **Description:** Storing the caravan at home on your driveway or private land.

#### Advantages:

- o Convenient access.
- No storage fees (if you own the property).

#### Disadvantages:

- o May require a special permit or be restricted in some areas.
- o Exposure to the elements and risk of theft/vandalism.
- May take up space and reduce parking or living space.

#### ☐ Storage Yards

Description: Large, often commercial, areas that offer caravan parking or storage.

#### Advantages:

- o Plenty of space for different sizes of caravans.
- o Secure fencing and sometimes 24/7 surveillance.

#### Disadvantages:

- $\circ\quad$  Limited control over who accesses the yard.
- o May be outdoors or under a basic cover.

#### ☐ Caravan Parks

• **Description:** Some caravan parks offer storage spaces for owners who do not want to keep their vehicles on their property.

#### Advantages:

- o Easy access to a secure, managed location.
- o Often include some basic maintenance or cleaning services.

# Disadvantages:

- Higher cost than open-air storage.
- Availability might be limited in certain areas.

### ☐ Self-Storage Units (for Caravans)

- **Description:** Renting a self-storage unit large enough to fit your caravan.
- Advantages:
  - o Fully enclosed and secure.
  - o Can store other items with your caravan.
- Disadvantages:



- Expensive compared to outdoor or covered storage.
- Requires good access, and sometimes limited hours.

# ☐ Farm or Rural Land Storage

- **Description:** Storing the caravan on a private farm or rural land (often cheaper, especially in remote areas).
- Advantages:
  - o Affordable in comparison to commercial options.
  - Peaceful and more secluded, reducing the risk of theft.
- Disadvantages:
  - o Less security.
  - o Limited accessibility or convenience.
  - Exposure to the elements unless sheltered.

# 7. Vermin and Pest Control

# Types of Vermin and Bugs That Could Infest a Caravan in Storage

- Rats: Large rodents that can chew through wires, upholstery, and insulation.
- Mice: Smaller rodents that nest in hidden spaces and leave droppings.
- Cockroaches: Insects attracted to food crumbs and dark, damp areas.
- Ants: Can invade foraging for food or establish colonies inside.
- Spiders: Often found in undisturbed corners, webs may indicate their presence.
- Silverfish: Thrive in dark, damp areas and feed on fabrics, paper, or adhesives.
- Moths: Lay eggs in fabric, causing damage to upholstery and clothing.
- Beetles: Carpet beetles and other species may infest soft furnishings.
- Termites: Can cause structural damage to wooden components.
- **Bed Bugs**: Can hide in mattresses and cushions, feeding on blood.
- Wasps or Bees: May build nests in small cavities or vents.
- Flies: May breed if food or organic waste is left behind.
- **Dust Mites**: Found in bedding and upholstery, thriving in humid conditions.
- Fleas: Can linger if pets were in the caravan.
- **Centipedes or Millipedes:** May enter for shelter in damp, dark areas.
- **Weevils**: Infest stored dry food like flour or grains if left behind.
- Woodlice: Found in damp areas, feeding on decaying material.
- Earwigs: Seek shelter in crevices and may be attracted to damp environments.
- Snakes or Lizards: In rare cases, small reptiles might take shelter.
- Birds or Bats: May enter if there are open vents or gaps, creating nests inside.

# **How to Protect Your Stored Caravan from Vermin and Pests**

- Thorough Cleaning: Remove all food, crumbs, and waste to eliminate attractants.
- **Seal Entry Points**: Inspect and block any holes, gaps, or vents with mesh or sealant to prevent access.
- **Use Repellents**: Place natural or chemical repellents, such as mothballs, peppermint oil, or commercial rodent deterrents, inside the caravan.
- **Deploy Traps**: Set rodent and insect traps in areas prone to infestation.
- Vent Covers: Install fine mesh covers over air vents to block insects and small animals.
- Protect Soft Furnishings: Store cushions, bedding, and other textiles in sealed, pestproof bags.
- Secure Food Storage: Remove all food items or store them in airtight, pest-proof containers.
- Inspect Regularly: Check the caravan periodically for signs of vermin or pest activity.
- Use Ultrasonic Devices: Install ultrasonic pest repellents to deter rodents and insects.





- Elevate the Caravan: Place the caravan on stands to limit access by crawling pests.
- Wheel and Jack Protection: Wrap wheels and jacks with plastic or deterrent materials to prevent climbing.
- **Remove Moisture**: Use dehumidifiers or moisture absorbers to reduce dampness that attracts pests.
- Close Curtains and Blinds: Block light and warmth from attracting pests.
- **Maintain Surroundings**: Keep the storage area clean, clear of debris, and free from overgrown vegetation.
- **Professional Pest Control**: Consider hiring a pest control service to treat the storage area or caravan.
- Check Insurance: Ensure your insurance policy covers damage caused by vermin or pests.
- **Inspect Before Use:** Thoroughly check the caravan for infestations or damage before using it again.

11. Ch	eck Insurance Ensure your insurance covers the caravan while in storage. Inform your insurer about the storage location if required.
